The National Fish Habitat Partnership **WORKS TO CONSERVE FISH HABITAT NATIONWIDE**, leveraging federal, state, tribal, and private funding resources to achieve the greatest benefit for fish populations through priority freshwater, coastal, and estuarine conservation projects.

*From 2006 – 2011, conservation project funding has included **\$63 Million in funding from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service** and was leveraged with nearly **\$102 million in non-federal funding.**
