ACE Act Re - Authorization Activity

- Bill passed out of Senate EPW without any contention
- Bill is being hotlined in the Senate
- Potential next steps
 - Pass through Senate (hopefully without objections)
 - Use that as leverage to get it through the House as is
- Changes that have made it into the base text of ACE Act 2.0

Ace Act 2.0

Adding two Board Seats (BLM, and ensuring EFMC and MFC have a seat) ACE Act funding timeline – remove "following fiscal year" language to provide flexible funding timeline driven by the Board Federal match requirement changes 50% of the total cost of all fish habitat conservation projects come from non-Federal funds (Partnership level match) Board authority to recommend operations funding have no cost-share Add BLM to agencies receiving technical assistance and get funding for it Increase authorization funding to \$10 million (from \$7.2)

Add an authorization of \$1M for the National Fish Habitat Assessment

Ace Act 2.0

- Reauthorization of the NFHP program through 2030
- Clarification on annual report on updates to FHPs: required only when there are changes
- Clarification on 5-year summary report: have one condensed report as opposed to two overlapping reports
- Exemption to be added that would allow FHP coordination "projects" to be submitted without non-Federal match requirement

Federal Agency Contribution Summary

Policy Committee / NFHP Chair requested (November 2023)

<u>Action</u>: a qualitative or quantitative (i.e., funding, staff resources, where possible) estimate of scientific and technical support, and (if any) additional NFHP support provided by the five partner agencies of NFHP

- Annual average of support since the passage of the ACE Act
- Back of the envelope calculation

Federal Agency Contribution Summary

- Received responses from all 5 agencies
- Responses varied
- 1/5 agencies receive appropriated funds (USFWS)
- 3/5 agencies indicated agencies support at about or more than the authorized level (400K), but do not receive direct NFHP appropriations
 - Examples include: NFHP staff support, FHP coordination, FHP and NFHP committees, outreach and education, and leveraged funding
- Follow up with individual agencies to see if they want assistance making the request for funding through OMB and their agencies (policy committee support)

Other Activities

- Submitted appropriations requests to House and Senate for FY25
- Hill visits schedule for the afternoon of May 1st and all day May 2nd
 - Coordinating with DucksUnlimited

ABOUT THE ACE ACT REAUTHORIZATION

In 2020, the American Conservation Enhancement (ACE) Act was enacted. This bipartisan bill authorized or reauthorized numerous conservation efforts that benefit habitat and wildlife throughout the country. With many of these programs, such as NFHP, nearing the end of their authorization, the ACE Reauthorization Act (S. 3791) would continue and enhance these vital conservation programs.

We urge members of Congress to support the ACE Act Reauthorization to continue the impactful work of regional fish habitat partnerships, protect our nation's natural beauty, and conserve our wildlife.
