Informal NOAA NFHP Funding Opportunity

- **Goal**: Enhance collaboration with recreational, subsistence, cultural, and non-commercial fishing communities and to protect and restore habitat.
- Any coastal FHP or its partner is eligible.
- Applicants must receive endorsement from the FHP coordinator for the proposed project.
- Funds are transferred to partners via the interstate fisheries commissions.

BIL Opportunities – Building on 30+ Years of Partnering on Habitat Conservation


- NOAA's Office of Habitat Conservation works with our partners through funding opportunities and expert technical assistance

Funding Opportunity: National Fish Passage

- Up to **\$75M** available to support a broad range of fish passage projects in coastal ecosystems, including the Great Lakes
- Award range: \$750K \$8M, with typical funding ranging \$3M \$5M
- **Application period:** 10/30/24 2/10/25
- Broad eligibility

Funding Opportunity: Tribal Fish Passage

- Up to **\$20M** available to support tribal fish passage work and building tribal organizational capacity
- Award range: \$300K \$6M, with typical funding ranging \$500K \$4M
- **Application period:** 10/30/24 2/27/25
- Limited eligibility for federally recognized tribes, tribal organizations, and Alaska Native Corporations
