- 117 years of siltation and lowering spillway have greatly diminished storage capacity and habitat
- Remove 6-9 million cu yds of sediment (double storage)
- Increase ave depth to 8' and max depth to 15'



Permit filing to lead agenda for City Council

After more than two ears of planning, revitalzation of Lake Wichita may take a major leap forward

City Council meeting.

A resolution is on the agenda to award a professional services agreement to Carollo Engineers Inc. for preparation of a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Clean Water Act 404 permit. Obtaining the permit is the first step in a lengthy process to revamp the lake into a recreation

cost is \$304,800. About half of the funding comes from grants and donations solicited by the Lake Wichita Revitalization Committee and half from the city's Type B Sales Tax Corp. The permit will allow the city to begin excavation and shoreline

Now is the right time to revitalize Lake Wichita


Last week's Wichita Falls City Council meeting was a banner day for Lake Wichita.


State Rep. Pat Fallon said he will support a project to dredge Lake Wichita during a recent visit to Wichita Falls.
